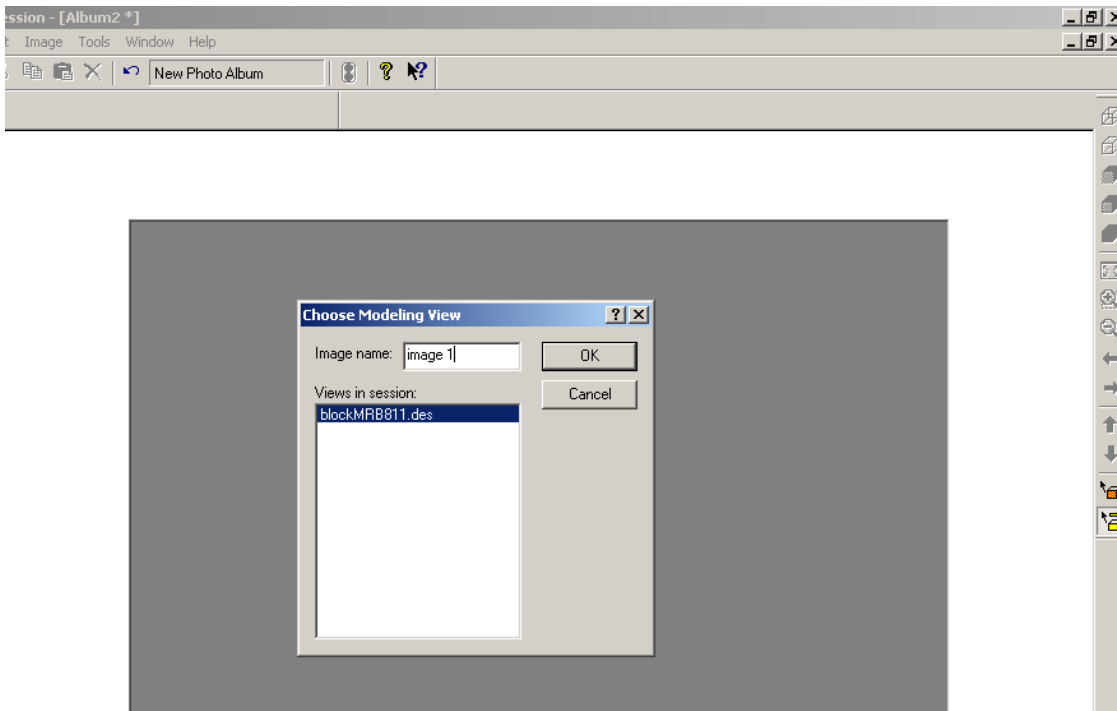


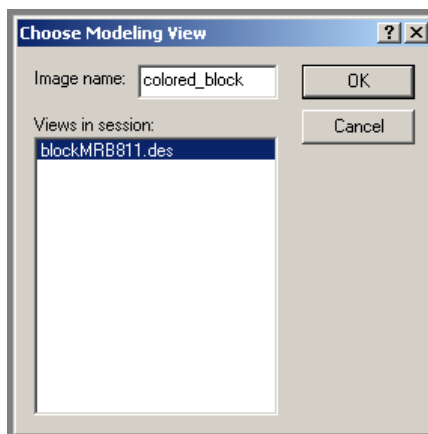
# Create An Album

Photo Albums allow you to make photo-realistic images of your designs. You can add colors, materials and background to make your designs and assemblies look like the real thing. Here's the procedure:

1. Be sure your *Design* is open.
2. Go to **File > New > Photo Album**.
3. Go to **Image -> New Image**.



4. You will get the *Choose Modeling View* box. The "*Views in session*" will be the filename of the design that will become a **Photo Album (BlockMRB811 in the example above)**.
5. Change the Image name to **colored\_block**. Click OK.



6. You will be using the following tools to color your design:




- **Select Faces**

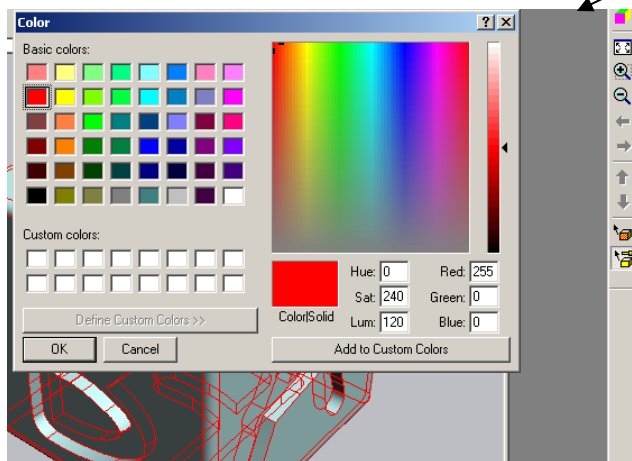
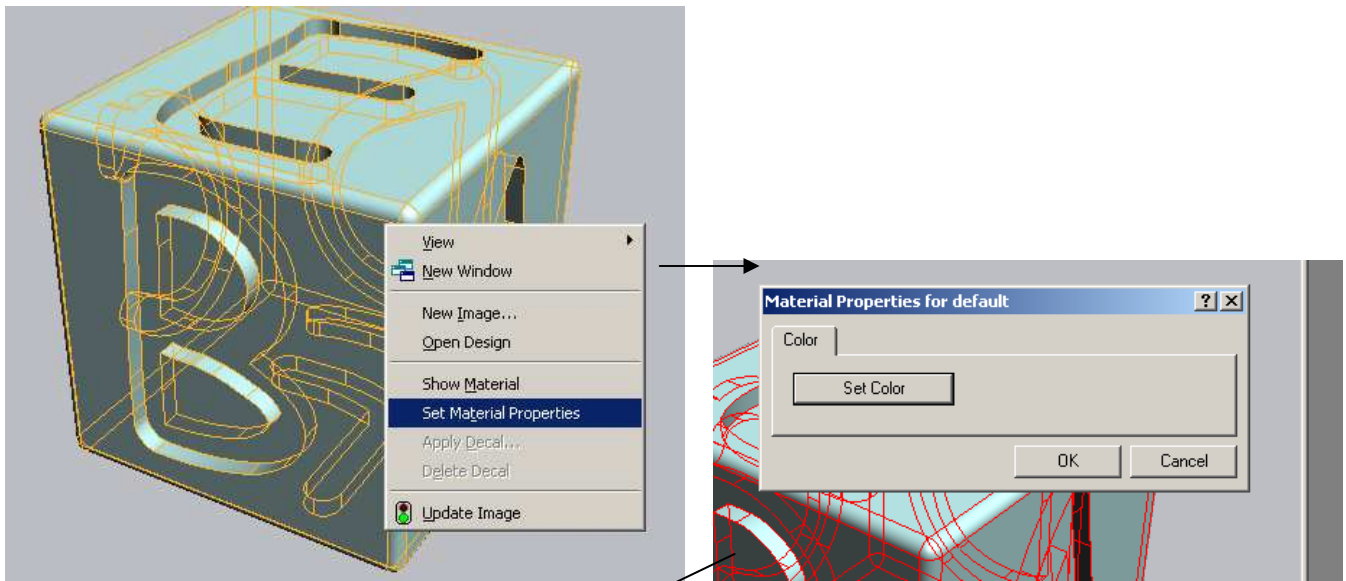




- **Select Parts**

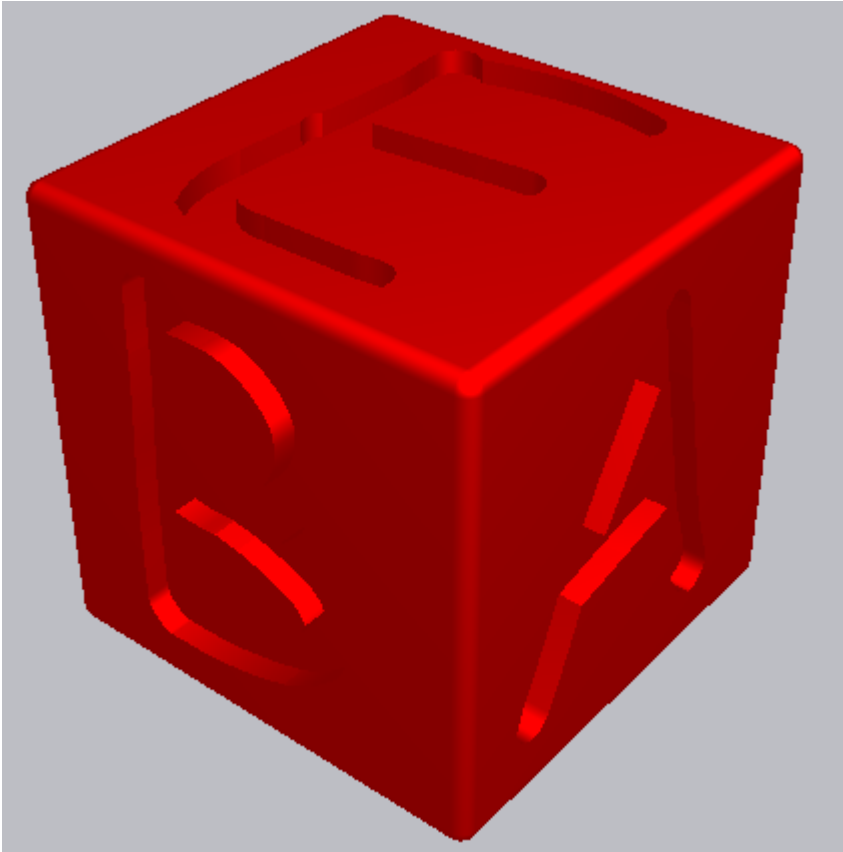



- **Update**

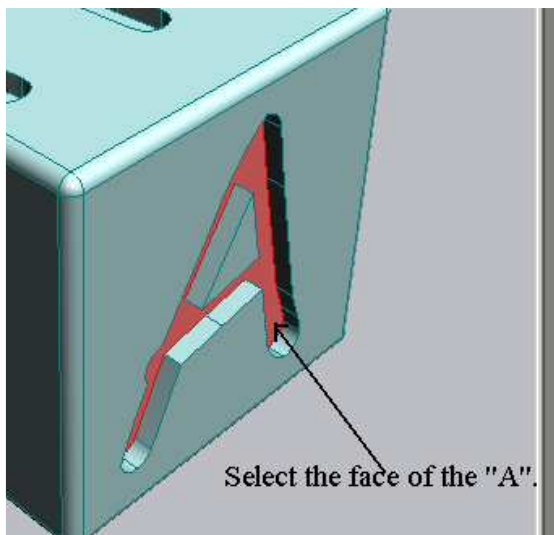
7. Click on **Select Parts** . **Hover your mouse over** your design to highlight the **wireframe** of your design. When the wireframe is highlighted, **click to select** the design, then **Right Click**. Select **Set Material Properties > Set Color**.





8. Choose a color for the block (*Red* has been chosen for *THIS* block). Click **OK > OK > Update** . If you rotate the view of your block, you will notice that the color is no longer there. Click Update  to retrieve the color.



9. *Rotate* your *View* of the block so that it is no longer colored. This makes it easier to select a face.
10. Next, click on **Select Faces** . Click on *face* of the letter "A". It should turn *red*.



11. **Right Click.** Select *Set Material Properties* > *Set Color*. Choose a *contrasting color*. (Black has been chosen for *THIS* letter.)
12. **Click OK > OK > Update** . If you rotate the view of your block, you will notice that the color is no longer there. Click Update  to retrieve the color.
13. Repeat this procedure for the other letters. Experiment with coloring other faces - the Rounded Edges, the flat faces around the letters. **BE CREATIVE!**
14. When you have finished coloring your Block, Go to **File > Export > JPG...**
15. Your **JPG** file will be exported and saved in the *same folder* as your **Photo Album**.
16. To Email your JPG, first open Outlook.
17. Go to **My Computer > Your "H" Drive > World of Tech > Block** folder. You will see a list of files in there.
18. Go to **View > Details**.
19. **Right Click** on the *colored\_block.jpg*. Choose **Send to > Mail Recipient**.
20. An *email message* will open. Finish setting up the email and send it.
